THE 1954 SEASON

By now you all should have a copy of the final season stats disk. I have spent quite a bit of time devouring all the stats. By the way this is the first time I have been in a league where you could do this by disk instead of reams of paper. But anyway, I am quite pleased with our stat results. However, it is painfully obvious to me that we had too much offense in the league at the expense of pitching. I believe one of the reasons for this is the lack of marginal players getting enough at bats. Partly to blame is the liberal batter limits we permitted i.e. the 130 game unlimited rule. With this in mind several adjustments are in order for the 1955 season and these can be found in the accompanying League Constitution. These limits may still be too liberal and if that is the case after the 55 season we will tighten them again. I believe that in any mail league, all players good, bad, and ugly must be included to guarantee accurate stats. We came pretty close in our first attempt and I hope these new limits will make the 55 season even better.
